



St. Louis Corvette Club Meeting

May 6, 2008 – Sunset Lakes Banquet Center



The meeting was called to order at 7:10 p.m. by president Bill Dotson. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited. Bill welcomed everyone and introduced board members, immediate past president Rick Friedrich, committee chairpersons, and club sponsor Mike Dean from Lynch Hummer. Newsletter chairman Mike Price was not in attendance. Members were reminded to sign the attendance sheet and purchase 50/50 tickets. Bill announced that for future meetings, the far row of parking spots on the front lot will be cordoned off for use by Corvette Club members during busy summer golfing months.

Guests and New Members

Bill welcomed guest Norman Brownsher who has a new '08 black convertible. New member Sally Godfrey was also welcomed. Sally joined the club at the April meeting. She owns a '77 cherry red coupe. Bill later welcomed guest Gwen Heineger who owns a '99 red convertible. Gwen "found" us via our club website and came to visit when we gathered at Syberg's before going to Diamond Mineral Springs in April.

Treasurer's Report

Treasurer Sara Gibson read the monthly report as it had not been included in the May newsletter. The balance as of March 21, 2008 was \$4,504.19. Income included new member dues totaling \$225.00 and April 50/50 proceeds of \$65.00. Disbursements included \$32.07 for newsletter expenses, \$96.00 for floral gifts, \$125.00 for NCCC dues, and \$55.00 for bank checks. The club's ending balance on April 29, 2008 was \$4,486.12. Rich Luebcke made a motion to accept the treasurer's report as presented. Bonnie Ruengert provided a second to the motion and it was approved by the membership.

Secretary's Report

Rich Luebcke noted the following correction to be made to the April 1, 2008 minutes: The Certificate of Assurance referred to in the National Council of Corvette Clubs Governor's Report is to be changed to Certificate of Insurance. Jean DuPont made a motion to accept the minutes from the April 1, 2008 meeting as published in the May newsletter and with the previously noted correction made. Jerry Craig provided a second to the motion and it was approved by the membership.

Membership Report

Angie Bradford recognized members celebrating May birthdays and anniversaries. She reported that there are currently 77 regular members, 10 associate members, and 1 honorary member (sponsor). Guests who joined as members at the April meeting were Sally Godfrey, Don and Anne Pickles, and Rick and Kathy Poepping.

National Corvette Museum Ambassador's Report

Judy Dooley said that the '08 victory red convertible raffled at the April C5-C6 Bash was won by a man in Maine. Raffle tickets are available for the August 30th raffle of an '09 red coupe. Luebckes, Ballingers, and Marty Dooley attended this year's Bash. 8" hexagon shaped bricks for the interior walkway leading into the new part of the museum are being sold for \$200 each. Non-museum members can purchase a brick for \$250. An emblem and/or photo can be included on the brick. Judy will provide a copy of the flier for inclusion in the newsletter.

National Council of Corvette Clubs Governor's Report

Rich Luebcke announced that the NCCC quarterly meeting was held in St. Louis May 2-4. The Midwest Region of NCCC boasts 2,167 members with 480+ members of FCOA (Future Corvette Owners Association). The Luebcke's almost-4-year-old grandson Steven Cook is soon to become member #3800. The 2008 national NCCC convention will be held in Tulsa in June. The 50th anniversary will be celebrated at the 2009 convention in Colorado Springs. Florida will be the host state for the 2010 convention. Members were asked if they would still be interested in receiving the NCCC yearly pin and pocket calendar. An activities list for the Midwest Region was provided. For members interested in drag racing, Gateway International Racetrack will be holding an all night Drag Racing event on Tuesday, May 6. May try to schedule more events at Gateway on off-club nights.

Armynta Craig asked why there is no STLCC patch on display in the NCCC room at the museum. Rich said he will see that a club patch is included in the display. He also mentioned that the museum is selling bricks from the original St. Louis Corvette plant for \$25.

By-Laws Proposal

Bill Dotson shared a final reading of a proposal to amend the by-laws to reflect the need for an annual budget. The proposal had been included in the May newsletter. There was no discussion of the proposal. Randy Howard made a motion to accept the proposed change. Jean DuPont provided a second to the motion. The motion was ratified by the membership. The approved change is as follows:

Article VIII, Section 4: Expenditures, paragraph C

An annual budget shall be prepared in January of each year by the Treasurer and submitted to the Board of Directors. The budget shall identify all significant items of income and expense of the club. This budget shall be ratified at the February meeting by the membership. The Treasurer will maintain a progressive comparison between the original budget amounts and actual expenditures and provide updates on a monthly basis.
