Governor's Report

This past month has been a busy one for me as I prepared for the 2023 National Convention of the National Council of Corvette Clubs. This has been the 8th convention that I've attended; this time it was held in Bowling Green, Kentucky, the

birthplace of all Corvettes since 1982. The national convention is an event I always enjoy because of the friends I've known for so many years. It is a special time with parties, tours, dinners and friendly competitions, be it rallyes, funkhanas, valve cover races, autocrosses, or drag racing. But most important is the time one spends with our corvette family! And, with an attendance of 746, it was the largest gathering ever.

This year, I decided to take my 2018 Grand Sport corvette. I looked forward eagerly to the track event - dubbed the "high speed autocross" which uses the 3.2 mile NCM Motorsports Park track. This event starts with a parade lap to familiarize the participants with the track. Afterwards, competitors get 4 one-lap timed runs. I watched many online YouTube videos to try to memorize the track to do my best, however, Mother Nature had different ideas as numerous thunderstorms with lightning appeared that afternoon and I was in the first afternoon heat. By rule, the track stops operation with lightning within 5 miles and I ended up waiting for the threat and rain to pass. Later that rainy afternoon, the lightning stopped and the forecast showed about a 1 hour window before the next thunderstorms would hit. The event chairman decided that the 80 plus participants should get at least one timed run, but there was no time for the parade lap - "One and Done" was the new game plan - make it your best effort! So off we went with each car starting about 45 seconds after the previous car. Since the track was still wet, I selected TRACK-WET on my GS and tried to mentally match my driving with the videos I had studied. With some cautious aggressiveness, I completed my run. Only the next morning at the awards breakfast, did I learn that I had won my class! I sure appreciated the effectiveness of those special modes that GM has put into my favorite sports car!

Beyond this, my most successful events were the in drag racing at Beech Bend. This was a very nice track in a pleasant wooded area with sheltered stands for the viewers - a much appreciated feature in the summertime sun.

The Matching Times drag event is an event scored against one's self in which you get 2 runs and try to match the elapsed time of the first run with that of the second. The newer corvettes have a nice advantage here with amazing consistency due to the engine and traction control devices.

The Bracket Racing event is a predicted time event - predict what you can run, but don't run quicker (a breakout) otherwise you'll lose. And if your opponent does a better job, they will advance. Most important is the reaction off the starting tree - the closer one comes to leaving an instant after the green light, the better you'll do.

Lastly is the Class Elimination Drags, otherwise known as Record Drags, because that's when class records can be set. In this event there is no breakout, but one can run quicker, but that will reset the index (or record). Although setting a record is nice, it does make it harder to win in the next round - because if the class index of your opponent is slower, they will get a head start based on the difference between their index and your new index (record).

In summary, I did well taking all 3 events, including Men's Top Eliminator, and set a new drag record in Class 1K of 11.94 seconds, again putting St Louis Corvette Club's name on the NCCC Official Drag Records list!

I guess I'd better start thinking about next year's NCCC Convention, this time it will be right here in our home state - in Joplin, Missouri! Hope to see you there!






