



The month of November traditionally has the club slowing down as winter weather approaches. The annual St. Louis Veterans Day Parade is usually one of our last events where we drive our cars. Here are some November happenings from previous years.

In November 2006, current member Rick Frierdich was our President, Karen Price was our Secretary and Gary Murray was Sergeant-at-Arms. Our meetings were held at Hessler's Pub on Tesson Ferry Road and there were 59 members in the club. Since we recently had several owners exchange cars within the club, it was reported that Gary and Jan Murray had just gotten their new C6 convertible, which

just so happens is now owned by Bob Bradley. The only event this month other than the parade was a lunch trip to Pere Marquette State Park and a river road drive. We were still doing our weekly Thursday night suppers at various restaurants in the area.

In November 2011, current member Marty Dooley was President, Mary Ann Hagenow was Secretary and Ron Hagenow was Membership. Sunset Hills Golf and Banquet Center was where our meetings were held, and we had 90 members. It was reported that everyone who went to Eureka Springs the previous month had a great time. We had several club members win awards for both the car show and autocross. If you haven't been there, then you need to make sure and attend next year. It was announced that Marty and Judy Dooley had recently purchased a Supersonic Blue Grand Sport convertible. In addition to the usual Veterans Day Parade, we went to Castelli's Moonlight Restaurant in Alton for their world-famous fried chicken. There was also an oil-change party at a member's house where after all the cars were serviced, we had a chance to do our favorite thing, eat! Later in the month we had a run to Miller's Grill in Washington, MO in memory of Jerry Fain, who was our first treasurer. It was also reported that at the previous month's club picnic, Judy Giovanoni put all the guys to shame by having the most correct answers to the Corvette Trivia game.


Most of the Board in November 2016 are still current members. Mike Price was President, Don Pickles was Treasurer, Erin Duke was Secretary, Judy Giovanoni was Membership and Gary Duke was Sergeant-at-Arms. We had 100 members, and our meetings were held at Grand Slam Sports Bar in Fenton. It was at this meeting that our current club shirts were unveiled and approved by the membership. Bob Kusky was working on a club calendar which featured our cars. Profits from the calendar sales were to go back to the treasury.

This following article was in the November 2016 Newsletter, and I thought it might

be of interest to the newer members. It was written by Jerry Craig, who most of us consider the "grandfather" and driving force in starting the club. It concerned Historic Motorama from 2002. Here is the article:

Next to the theatre at the Corvette Museum is a picture taken in 2002 of one of each year Corvettes from 1953 to 2003. General Motors wished to commemorate the 50 years of Corvette by assembling a group of one Corvette from each year of production. The group would drive from Flint Michigan to Detroit to St. Louis to Bowling Green, all cities where Corvettes were designed or made. On the road for five days, the group displayed at car shows, parks, dealers, and vendors along the way. Many magazine articles were written. Arriving at the Kentucky border the group was escorted to Bowling Green by the Kentucky State Patrol. It was a wild flat-out ride. At the Museum, a large crowd welcomed the travelers. Later that day the group assembled for a drive through the middle of the Corvette factory! Production stopped and employees cheered. Mid-year Corvettes did burn outs on the factory floor. Now, the rest of the story. A picture was taken on Kiener Plaza with the Arch in the background. Arriving in St. Louis, the group was met with the best parking lot party ever with free beer and lots of snacks provided by local Corvette Clubs. Judy and Marty Dooley were instrumental in the coordination. Later that evening the mayor's office called Marty with a major problem. It seems there was no way to get the Corvettes up on the Plaza. Curbs are 11 inches high. Marty called Jeff Craig and the two put in all-nighters to build ramps to get the Vettes up to and off the Plaza safely. A gray day cleared, and an awesome picture was taken. St Louis Corvette Club members Sharon and Carl Ballinger and Armynta and Jerry Craig made the trip. It was an amazing experience to see the group on the road. Truckers tooted. We met Sharon and Jim Love from Indiana. Actually, we met Sharon. Then a few days later we met Jim. Seems he was always out cleaning his wheels. If you've ever seen his wheels, you know why. One of each year Corvettes from 1953 to 2003. 50 years of Corvettes. Missing is the only 1983 Corvette which was thought to be too valuable to make the trip.
