Ladies Day Out Luncheon September 27th Thomas Sappington House/The Barn Restaurant





The Thomas Sappington House is one of the oldest brick structures in St. Louis County. Built in 1808 by enslaved people, it is named after its namesake, Thomas Sappington (1783-1843), whose family was one of the first to settle in the county. The house is a well-preserved and rare example of Federal-style architecture in the state. Given its association with Sappington and architecture, the house was added to the National Register of Historic Places in 1974. The house is part of a complex that features the research Library of Americana and Decorative Arts, and The Barn restaurant. The site is owned and maintained by the City of Crestwood, and the Sappington House Foundation, conservators for 55 years, operate the facility, with the exception of the restaurant.





Dockery Farms—This cotton plantation and sawmill is widely regarded as the place where Delta Blues music was born.




BB King Museum—Tells the story of King's life.

Tail of the Dragon and Devil's Triangle

It's strange how things happen. When Angie and I contacted Don and Anne Pickles to get information on the trip they planned several years previous, we were only gathering information for our vacation. Soon a number of members heard we were planning on taking a trip to the Tail of the Dragon and asked if we were going to make it a club trip. After discussing it we decided to give it a try. In June 2022 we made a trip to Tennessee and North Carolina to drive several fun routes and visit a number of venues with the intention of setting up the D & D Tour. No, not that D&D, The D&D I am referring to was a seven-day trip through Tennessee and part of North Carolina. We came up with the name D & D in honor of the two main routes we planned to drive, Tail of the Dragon & Devils Triangle. From the beginning, Angie and I let everyone know this would mainly be a driving trip but we also planned days that could be spent sightseeing. Overall, I think everyone who came along had a good time, but I think there is one word that best describes the trip – Wet.

Day 1

On Monday morning 19 June, 2023, under overcast, drizzly skies, nine Corvettes

departed from the Pilot gas station across from the entrance to WWT raceway toward Tennessee. Mike and Karen Price joined the group at the Rend Lake rest stop to bring our total to ten cars. After a lunch break at Rafferty's in Paducah, KY, we continued our longest day of driving (much of it in rain) toward our overnight destination of Oak Ridge, TN. The city of Oak Ridge was established in secrecy during World War Two for the sole purpose of creating the atomic bomb. Today the area is still a center for scientific research and technical innovation.

Day 2

Tuesday morning, we woke up to more rainy weather and made the short drive from our hotel to Brushy Mountain State Penitentiary located in Petros, TN. Brushy Mountain Penitentiary operated from 1896 until it was closed in 1993 and much of its history is dark and brutal. We had planned to tour the prison and then drive the Devils Triangle. Unfortunately, when we arrived at the prison, we discovered their actual hours of operation differed from those posted online. In the parking lot of the gift shop is an old bus that has been turned into a Rat Rod complete with a skeleton driver.









Quickly pivoting, we decided to take the drive first and then take the tour. Starting at the old prison we enjoyed 44 miles of narrow, twisting roads through the Smoky Mountains (it was like a roller coaster for cars) that brought us back to the prison.



While the majority of the group opted to take the prison tour, Angie and I took another run at the Devils Triangle so she could have fun behind the wheel. We then joined the rest of the group for lunch at the prison gift shop and found ourselves behind bars doing hard time (speeding?).




After lunch and shopping we departed for a two-hour drive to Asheville,

NC. Dinner that night was at the Harbor Inn Seafood Restaurant.



Day 3

Wednesday turned out to be another rainy day, are you seeing a pattern? Most of the group departed the hotel for the short drive to the Biltmore estate, where we toured the gardens and the mansion. The Biltmore mansion is a beautiful building constructed by George Vanderbilt on 8,000 beautifully landscaped acres and displays all the excesses of the gilded age. We enjoyed lunch in the stable restaurant and then continued touring the grounds. Many of us then ended up stopping at Antler Hill Village where we did a little shopping, toured the barns and craft area or enjoyed a drink. Jerry and Pam Schmidt were fortunate enough to get tickets for the wine tasting and had departed right after lunch for their scheduled time. Eventually we all drove back to the hotel to dry out and relax before dinner.















Barb and Ken Payne had previously been to the Biltmore Estate and opted not to visit again. They spent the day touring the Estes-Winn car museum and Grovewood Village. These buildings are now home to a thriving collection of shops specializing in crafts created by local artisans and a small museum dedicated to its origins as the textile and woodworking operations for Biltmore Industries. The Grove Park Inn is a century old luxury hotel that has hosted many celebrities and dignitaries. It also has spectacular views of the surrounding mountains and the city of Asheville. As a side note, the hotel also hosts the National gingerbread house competition. The gingerbread houses are large, and they are like nothing you have ever seen before with many operational features like sleds sliding down a hill.



Dinner that night was at the Stone Ridge Tavern which I discovered was the same restaurant Don and Anne took the group to when they did their trip. What can I say except great minds think alike. 


