2024 Build your own Corvette or \$85,000.00. Tickets are \$250.00 each. Drawing on June 27, 2024, at 2 p.m.


2024 Black Coupe. Tickets are \$150.00 each. To be raffled off on July 18, 2024, at 2 p.m.



The first stop on Friday was the Civil War Museum in Downtown Vicksburg. The Civil War Museum is owned by Charles Pendelton. It contains hundreds of artifacts from the Civil war and emphasizes stories of African Americans during the Civil War.

The USS Cairo was sunk by two explosions on December 12, 1862. Fortunately, no lives were lost. It was raised in December 1964 and restored. It is now on display at the Vicksburg National Military Park.

The Rosalie House, Natchez, Mississippi was built between 1820 and 1823 for Peter and Eliza Little. It is beautifully preserved and contains many original items.











The Longwood House in Natchez, Mississippi has an octagonal design. Construction on the Longwood House began in 1860 but was halted in 1861 because of the Civil War. The outside of the house is finished, but on the inside only the first floor is completed.


